Clay Wings Toward Starry Skies

Walking on the shards, back and forth, before the Meeting exhibition opened its doors to visitors, that August 20, 2024, I heard the crunchy sound of **broken tiles under my feet** and felt that sensation of **instability** you get when the ground is not firm, when you don't know what angle your foot will take when it touches the ground. Like in the mountains, like on a raft, like on the subway when a sudden stop sends you toppling onto the lady clinging to the rail next to you, and she gives you a dirty look...

Noise and instability.

Then I felt again—yes, felt again—that sense of fragility I have experienced many times in life when something broke, inside or outside of me. This made me remember, with renewed affection, the reason why Progetto Arca was born and has grown over these thirty- one years, drawing in beneficiaries and staff, institutions and private donors, friends, souls, lives. For us, fragility is not the discomfort to be avoided or hidden, not the limitation that blocks our personal evolution, but the fertile ground on which we confront ourselves—it is a condition common to every living being on Earth.

Observation tells us that precisely from those crises, from those fragilities, almost always bloom the urges to become better, to rediscover our own aspirations. Fragility, playing on the uncontainable power of the innate desire for life, forces us to make even difficult choices, to shake up routine, urges us to look up toward our potential to be rediscovered and, above all, to be loved. This is Progetto Arca's mission: we stand beside those walking on those shards to help them reclaim the responsibility of caring for themselves. What Progetto Arca does, then, is only this: reduce to a minimum the factor that holds back this process of regeneration—loneliness.

Together we can face almost anything, feeling loved we can fight for ourselves even when self-esteem has abandoned us, being able to count on someone makes us less afraid of the unknown, which is surely waiting for us at the end of the uncertain walk. And so, as the final space of the Meeting exhibition, the work of Alberto Gianfreda—a moving form of a woman created by linking, with fine chains, the shards just far enough apart to preserve the memory of the scars, signs of healed wounds that speak of rebirth. I glimpse her in the space defined by



colorful curtains and find, in the artwork, all the value of **fragility** transformed into **courage** thanks to the **relationship** with someone who does not fear my weakness but, in fact, admires it as the **light of a star**. The pieces in which I was once broken now come together in **a new**, **harmonious**, **and beautiful form**, certainly different from what it was before, but closer to who I am now and who I may yet become.

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Our beneficiaries

Homeless people

The condition of living on the street is to be considered one of the most severe forms of material deprivation and social exclusion.

Separation from a spouse, loss of stable employment, health-related factors, denial of political asylum or loss of the requirements for maintaining a residence permit are among the events, often combined, that contribute to the condition of homelessness and the consequent loss of civil and social rights.

According to the latest ISTAT

Families in poverty

It is increasing in the North, affects minors, and does not even spare those who work. This is the picture from the latest ISTAT report on absolute poverty: in Italy, 2.2 million families and almost **5.7 million people** are forced to choose between paying rent, getting medical care, or buying food. The most alarming data concerns minors: almost 1.3 million children and adolescents live in poverty, the highest number since 2014. Also worrying is the housing emergency, the other face of poverty. In 2023, 21,345 families were evicted, with Lombardy leading in the number of cases (6,931). Involuntary non-payment remains the main cause of housing insecurity.

Migrants

In 2024 the number of migrant landings on Italian coasts decreased. Also due to bilateral agreements signed with Libya and Tunisia, sea arrivals decreased by 58%, dropping from 157,651 in 2023 to 66,317 in 2024 (Ministry of the Interior). Bangladesh and Syria are the main countries of origin, followed by Tunisia, Egypt, and Guinea. This significant reduction in landings does not reduce the complexity of the migration phenomenon and its implications. The toll from shipwrecks remains tragically high: the central Mediterranean route continues to be the deadliest, with over 2,000 victims including the dead and missing in the desperate attempt to reach the Italian coast.

Unaccompanied foreign minors

The expression "unaccompanied foreign minor" refers to a young person under the age of 18, without European citizenship, who has arrived in Italy or another Member State, without parents or adults legally responsible for them. Given the particular vulnerability of these children and adolescents. Italian law (L. 47/2017) establishes that they have the right to access a dedicated protection system. According to data from the Ministry of the Interior, as of December 31, 2024, 8,043 unaccompanied foreign minors arrived in Italy by sea. The majority are adolescents between 15 and 17 years old.

People with addiction issues

The **570 active Ser.D.** in Italy assisted, in 2024, 132,195 people with substance **dependence**. The majority are men (85%), of Italian nationality (91%), with an average age of 34 at the time of first treatment. Heroin remains the most common primary substance, but **cocaine** is the most prevalent among new users. Those under 25 are in treatment for cannabinoid use (2024 Drug Addiction Report). The phenomenon of addiction is actually much broader: alcohol abuse, pathological gambling, and compulsive internet use often lead to social isolation, without adequate access to care services.

From our observatory

The requests for help we receive, the cases we address within our services, and the results of the "Poveri noi!" survey, which we commissioned from BVA Doxa, highlight a hidden and silent **poverty** that creeps into the homes of even those with an income who, on the surface, lead a "normal" life. They are the **next-door poor**, invisible precisely because they are part of our social fabric. It is the family that can't enroll their children in sports or send them on school trips, that has stopped inviting friends over, that must come up with excuses when invited to a birthday party or out to dinner. It is not the absolute poverty of those who have to deal with an empty fridge, but a poverty of life and experiences, equally concerning, that limits access to education, produces social isolation, and puts the future at risk. Only through a multidimensional approach, capable of grasping all its complexity, can this poverty truly be addressed.



Every day, workers and volunteers engage in essential frontline outreach work: distributing essential goods, monitoring critical situations, building trusting relationships, and connecting people with health and social services. More than a hot meal or basic necessity, the goal is material and relational recovery. The ultimate aim is to help people rebuild self-worth, as the first step toward leaving behind need and exclusion.

Talking to the Street Unit volunteers helped me a lot not to lose sight of who I was — and especially, who I could become again. Igor

The Food Truck service is a guarantee of concrete help and relational proximity where it's most needed: on the street. Our food trucks continue to serve the cities of Milan-where the service originated-Varese, Turin, Padua, Rome, Naples, Bacoli, and Bari. Over 320,000 were distributed, including dinners and breakfasts produced locally and increasingly provided by nonprofit organizations. The Food Truck — easy to recognize — has become a nightly appointment and a safe haven for those seeking good food, comfort, and guidance toward health and social services.



THEMPORARY SHELTERS

Support, shelter, listening, socialization, protection of rights. Temporary shelters are the first reception facilities that meet the most urgent needs of people without a home and serve the vital function of acting as a link to the broader support system. In Milan, we run the Piccolo Rifugio, an emergency overnight shelter for people without a home intercepted by the Street Unitoperating year-round, with even greater intensity during winter, the most difficult period for those without housing. In 2024 in Varese, inside a building confiscated from organized crime, we inaugurated "Casa Arca." Thanks to the involvement of a wide network of territorial partners, the facility expanded the services of the previous day center "Il Viandante" to include canteen, personal care, and medical and legal assistance.





THE ENZO JANNACCI RECEPTION HOUSE

Casa Jannacci, on Viale Ortles 69 in Milan, is one of the largest public reception centers in Europe. Founded in the 1950s as the "Dormitory of Viale Ortles," it is now much more than a dormitory. It is a house for temporary reception of people without a home or households in serious need, lacking housing and support networks. At Casa Jannacci, guests find not only a bed and shelter, but also support, care, assistance, social opportunities, and reintegration possibilities—thanks to the work of a multidisciplinary team. The facility includes a day center, a library with workstations and Wi-Fi, an Italian language school, a job support desk, an INPS help desk, and a nursing clinic active seven days a week. The educational project also includes spaces dedicated to practical activities like carpentry workshops, cooking, gardening, and a creative workshop for sewing, drawing, and embroidery. Starting August 2024, Casa Jannacci—managed by the City of Milan—is run by a temporary business Association, with MediHospes as the lead organization and Progetto Arca as deputy general manager and coordinator of the socio-psycho-pedagogical area. The other seven members of the ATS are: AmbienteAcqua, Cumse, Cura e Riabilitazione, Progetto Mirasole, International Rescue Committee, Kayros, and Naturalia.

Progetto Arca has been active in migration since 2005, welcoming those fleeing war and poverty. In the centers for extraordinary reception (CAS), in CAS housing units, and in SAI apartments (Reception and Integration System), we support the integration path for asylum seekers and holders of international protection, as well as for vulnerable categories such as victims of violence or trafficking.

The project includes support throughout the legislative asylum process: healthcare, psychological support, Italian language courses, access to professional training courses, and support in finding work and independent housing solutions. In 2024, the reception of unaccompanied foreign minors continued as well: a psychologist specialized in adolescence and trauma was added to the staff, and we activated workshops on emotional education.

In Italy I went to school for the first time in my life. It was an exciting discovery. Now I have many paths ahead of me that I can choose from, and I'm sure I'll make it because I'm not alone. Ossam

The first fundamental right of those without a home is the right to care. Defending it is what we do every day through outpatient clinics in our reception centers and the Post acute for homeless. This service supports people without a home, discharged from hospitals and often affected by multiple pathologies, who need continuous nursing and medical therapeutic care to prevent relapse or readmission—common for those living on the street. Our approach provides for comprehensive care of the person: the healthcare team works alongside the social team and territorial services to ensure, at discharge, integration into a social project or access to other care and rehabilitation services.

In Housing services, we work with beneficiaries who have different levels of autonomy. The first category includes people without a home, welcomed from the street into apartments—either shared or for exclusive use—based on specific vulnerabilities and needs. Some apartments are also dedicated to homeless people and their dogs, a housing option that preserves the bond with what is often their only and inseparable companion in life. Each quest is supported by a multidisciplinary team on a path of gradual recovery of physical wellbeing and maximum autonomy possible: socially, economically, and residentially. The reference model is Housing First, which overturns the traditional stepbased therapeutic path (sidewalkdormitory-communityapartment) and makes housing the

first and essential starting point for building a future of inclusion

and stability.



Social housing for families in poverty offers temporary housing solutions for single-parent families in temporary difficulty, housing support for Rom families leaving unauthorized settlements, emergency housing following evictions, and housing autonomy projects for low-income families and individuals who, despite working, cannot access housing on the open market. The support is limited in time but with long enough duration (up to two years), is free or includes a shared-cost contribution, and is part of a social – educational project aimed at autonomy, including: setting up a savings plan, support in job search or training, financial education for better money management, and skill-building for long-term housing independence.

The network of 12 canteens supported by Progetto Arca in Italy is constantly growing, proof that the food need is not slowing down. We want our canteens, in addition to satisfying hunger with dignity and food security, to be places where people can receive other nourishment—the relational care that responds to global needs of the person: orientation, medical support, legal aid, access to credit and housing, as well as training and work activities. We succeed in making the canteens socially effective thanks to the availability of local partners who manage the services, sharing in the organization and mission.

Grocery shopping is one of the most common activities—but for more and more families, it's become an obstacle course. We are gradually replacing the delivery of standardized food parcels with access to Social Markets, now present across the country.

Here, individuals and families find regular and free support for their food needs, choosing the most appropriate products themselves. Social Markets are also enriched with additional services: listening centers, clothing closets, financial and food education courses, support for accessing economic benefits. They foster local civic engagement involving both agri-food chain entities and regular citizens who volunteer their time.

Our work is focused in one of Calcutta's poorest slums, where Mother Teresa's legacy lives on daily in the children who live on the street or near the train stations. The Missionaries of Charity distribute 100 kilos of bread made at the bakery we support.

Since 2023, we have also helped through a mobile medical camper, reaching people who are bedridden in remote villages and unable to travel independently to clinics. In 2024 we supported the organization of Christmas celebrations, where over 500 people shared a Christmas meal and received food parcels. In January, Calcutta hosted one of our first volunteer campuses.

There is no more atrocious injustice than believing you are unworthy of anything, especially your own poverty and submission. Seva Kendra aims to break the caste culture and restore trust in the possibility of progress and social well-being. Noemi





SUPPORT FOR DEVELOPMENT IN SOUTH AMERICA, AFRICA, AND ASIA

In **South America**, we continued support in **Brazil** in the cities of Parintins, Amazonas and Salvador de Bahia, in collaboration with the Centro Educativo di Nossa Senhora das Graças and Associação Centro de Educação Infantil João Paulo II. These centers supported over 490 children and teens, from a few months old up to 17 years, providing meals that were often their only meal of the day. We also distributed food parcels to over 300 families and ran agricultural training programs focused on empowering women. In **Venezuela**, with Asociación Civil Trabajo y Persona, and in **Argentina**, with Asociación Aime Neviede, 270 children were regularly supported with over 130,000 meals.

In the **African continent**, we supported educational and family aid programs, including long-distance sponsorships, for 60 children in **Uganda**, **Ivory Coast**, **and South Sudan**, in partnership with AVSI and local organizations.

In the **Asian continent**, particularly **Nepal**, a new program was launched to assist a children's shelter for minors aged 3 to 17, in collaboration with CDF Nepal and Our Child Protection Foundation Nepal in Kathmandu. In the same district, food assistance was provided to 20 families in need, in collaboration with local partners and social services. We also supported the community of Klang Leu, in **Cambodia**, through Let Us Create Futures, assisting around 100 vulnerable families in Preah Sihanouk.

What always strikes me about South American communities is the hope with which they face difficulties that would be insurmountable for us Westerners. They teach us to love life for what it is and for what little it offers. Patrizia

Responding to Humanitarian Emergencies

THE WAR IN UKRAINE

We've been in Ukraine since the war began. Also in 2024, we continued our involvement in the **Emergency Program** "Emergency initiative in support of the population affected by the conflict in Ukraine and neighboring countries" **funded by AICS**, with two specific projects:

- A multisectoral emergency intervention to support vulnerable and displaced populations in the cities of Chernivtsi, Rivne, Irpin and nearby areas of Kherson, Mykolaiv, Dnipro, Zaporizhzhia, Zhytomyr and Kyiv, in collaboration with over 30 Italian OSCs and local partners.
- An emergency humanitarian assistance and social support intervention for both displaced and non-displaced populations in the regions of Sumy, Kharkiv, Mykolaiv, and in Kyiv, in collaboration with local partners.

The initiatives included support for **canteens** in four refugee camps, renovation of **eight shelters** to safely restart school activities for children, setup and launch of a **reception center for transit migrants** in western Ukraine, restoration and sanitation of **drinking water** in bomb-damaged areas, distribution of **essential goods**, and access to **medical care**.

The project will end in June 2025 and continue with new funding.





In Ukraine, we are working in a complex situation. Air raid sirens mark our days. Power outages happen suddenly, leaving entire neighborhoods without electricity. We often spend the nights in underground shelters, in crowded spaces, with the sound of explosions in the background.

In this difficult context, our work takes on even more meaning.

The activities we carry out respond to essential needs: we set up beds for those without shelter, run canteens, and deliver food parcels to those who have nothing. We provide stoves where heating is lacking, and support schools so children can keep studying. These are simple but vital actions for those living in emergency conditions.

Every gesture of gratitude we receive from people and institutions confirms that what we do truly matters. It's what keeps us going, day after day, even when the situation remains tough.

OTHER EMERGENCY RESPONSES

Elsewhere in Europe, we acted swiftly with our Food Truck and distribution of emergency food in **Valencia**, Spain, following the devastating flood in October 2024.

In just three months, our volunteers covered the fragile territory of the city, distributing 13,000 meals to the local population. In Romania, in collaboration with Remar Ukraine, we continued to provide food assistance to 100 war refugees on the border between the two countries.

At the end of March 2025, also through local partners, we provided food and emergency goods to communities affected by the **devastating earthquake in Myanmar**.


Economic value generated in 2024


Through financial statement data, we demonstrate our ability to **generate value and distribute** it to fulfill the goals of our mission. All generated economic value is used to support our interventions, primarily **covering social activities**, which indirectly **promote the development of fundraising activities**, especially for projects that are not fully financed by public institutions. Proceeds not derived from public funding come from private individuals and foundations supporting social impact initiatives.


Total proceeds in 2024 amount to €32,182,711, of which 52% are from institutional assistance and reception activities, and 48% are from fundraising, necessary to support social services not covered by institutional funds.

Compared to 2023, **proceeds increased** by more than €1,300,000, partly due to the rise in general interest activities (including international cooperation) and fundraising, and partly due to increased returns from financial and capital activities.

ORIGIN OF PROCEEDS 2024








How we distributed the economic value generated in 2024


The total costs in 2024, including taxes, amount to €31,836,203, an increase proportional to the rise in revenue. Assistance and reception services absorbed 68% of the generated economic value. The portion of generated economic value that supported the execution of fundraising actions accounts for 16% of total costs and ensured the continuity of reception and assistance services where not covered by institutional funding. These funds are also invested in launching startups and new projects and interventions, in Italy and abroad, before they are included in public or private funding programs. Our commitment is to respond to social and humanitarian emergencies with the promptness and intensity required for initial relief of beneficiaries, followed by more structured paths to sustainability.

The economic value used for managing mission-related activities is allocated 82% to covering the direct assistance costs. This percentage includes costs for directly involved personnel and management expenses, such as food, hygiene products for people and homes, essentials, medicines and medical visits, utility bills and maintenance of reception facilities, and vehicle costs. It also covers costs related to logistics, cleaning, and warehouses, which ensure the highest quality hospitality for people welcomed. 4% is allocated to research and development, focusing on staff training and evaluation of intervention quality and social impact. The remaining 14% is needed to support the administrative structure and management necessary to carry out our mission, along with other expenses like depreciation, financial charges, and taxes.

87% of fundraising revenue comes from over 180,000 individual donors who have supported Progetto Arca's activities through one-time or recurring donations, the 5x1000 tax allocation, by responding to our appeals, with online donations, or by leaving a legacy donation. Again this year, we welcomed many new donors, thanks especially to Direct mailing campaigns and Face-to-Face channels. In 2024, 7,227 new regular donors joined our big family. Also notable is the engagement of those who chose to support us with a one-time donation: 193 large donors. 2024 also stands out for the growth in partnerships with companies: 83 medium and large companies (66 in 2023) supported our projects with monetary donations, goods, skills and services, or by organizing corporate volunteering. Another strong bond with Progetto Arca is through support from 20 foundations, which have shared with us a trust built over time, thanks to their punctual and detailed reporting requests. Housing and food support projects, like our mobile kitchens and solidarity markets, continue to be appreciated and recognized by donors, identifying us as a reliable reality capable of offering concrete responses to growing social needs.
